The Most Holy Body And Blood Of Christ

In our modern times, symbol can seem to have lost its value. The most recognizable "signs" are ones we see on the road or the branding in advertisements. The logos for major companies don't do much more than perk our interest or disdain. They surely don't deliver on their promises for our lives to be happier, healthier, and easier.

On this feast of Corpus Christi, we hear the account of the Last Supper. This was Passover, an ancient sign of the covenant of Moses. The Hebrew people celebrated God's providential care for His people. To the listening disciples, Jesus makes a very bold claim. "This is my blood of the covenant." At the time of the first Passover -- the redemption of the Hebrew people from slavery to the Egyptians -- the blood of the sacrificial lamb was spread on the lintels of the doorpost. Tomorrow, some of the disciples would witness the blood of the new covenant spread across the wood of the cross.

Christ's Body and Blood are more than a sign. They are a sacrament. In the sacrament, the sign makes real what it signifies. More than ritual, a sacrament enacts truth of the covenantal love of God and His promise of fidelity. It's a promise God keeps. The same bread and wine of that first Holy Thursday liturgy becomes -- throughout the centuries and until the end of time -- the very Body and Blood of Christ. On this feast, we celebrate the unfailing covenantal love of our God. As you partake in the Eucharist today, and next Sunday, and the Sunday after that, remember that you receive neither a meaningless sign nor an empty offer. You receive God Himself, as He fulfills His promise to remain with us always.

Text Message Scam From the Diocese of Syracuse Office of Communications: please be aware of a text/ phone scam involving the use of cell phone num-

bers with a 315 area code, sent by individuals claiming to be diocesan priest. The text claimed to be from a retired diocesan priest, and it stated that he was traveling, got into a bind and needed money (the retired priest did not send the message). Text message spam is illegal and is usually an attempt to get the receiver to provide personal information, such as social security numbers or banking information. Here are a few tips to avoid repercussions from text message spam:

- Do not respond to the text message
- Do not click on any links that may be included in the message
- Delete the message
- Add your cell phone number to the National Do Not Call Registry

If you receive a similar spam text message (or phone call) from someone claiming to be a priest of the Diocese of Syracuse, please notify the diocesan Office of Communications at 315-459-7170. We are also aware of similar scam requests sent by email; if you receive an email claiming to be sent by a diocesan priest asking for money or personal information, do not reply and forward the email to khopkins@syrdio.org.

A Family Perspective

One gets the impression there was always a lot of sharing, discussion and learning during the many meals Jesus and the disciples ate together. How does this compare to the meals in your home? Today's gospel challenges us to make our meals more than physical functions and more a time for sharing.



Ever since the night Moses led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt, God's people remembered that special night with the Passover meal. They ate flat bread, just as the Israelites did the night they left Egypt. They drank wine, remembering the lamb's blood that saved the Israelites from the Angel of Death. Jesus ate the Passover meal with his disciples. As they ate, Jesus taught his disciples that, under God's new agreement, his own body and blood would save them.

Mission for the Week

Using the concordance found at the back of your Bible, look up the word "Passover." As a family, write down the verses, find them in your Bible, and read them out loud. Sometimes Jesus is referred to as the Lamb of God, or the Lamb sacrificed for our sins. Talk about how Jesus took our sins away when he died on the cross.

Dear God, help me to be truly thankful for the way Jesus gave up his own body and blood to save me from my sins. Amen.

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

and it is a good time to stop and reflect on the precious gift of the Eucharist that the Lord has left His Church.
