

First Sunday In Advent

Tribulation. Wildfires. Tsunamis. Moral corruption. Disease. War. We tend to associate these things with the end times, and perhaps for good reason! In today's Gospel, Jesus says: "People will die of fright in anticipation of what is coming upon the world." Not exactly putting us in the Christmas spirit, is it? During Advent, we anticipate a celebration of Christ's first coming. There is a quiet stillness about our waiting, or at least we try to encourage that in ourselves. Perhaps we have an Advent devotional or we take time to pray together as a family around the Advent wreath.

But Jesus did not come only once into history. During Advent, we remember that he will come again. You may remember the rapture craze in the early 2000s, when a series of books and movies envisioned a future where Jesus was coming soon and all the true believers had been whisked away. Everyone else had one more chance to repent before things really went to hell...literally, in this case!

But is that what Jesus is talking about here? The truth is, we don't know what Jesus' Second Coming will be like. The actual return of Christ - though sudden and perhaps frightening to some - should not frighten us. Despite all the stories we may have heard about the apocalypse, the advice of Jesus is not to hang our heads or cower in fear. "Stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand." In a certain sense, we are already living in the end times. We already encounter great tribulation. We all find it easy to get distracted or discouraged in the grind of daily life. Today's Gospel reminds us that vigilance for God's presence is needed now.

1 Dear Parishioners,



This Sunday we begin our observance of Advent, one of the most beautiful seasons of the year. For me, much of its beauty comes from the fact that it approaches the next few weeks in such a different way than the world around us does. The world "out there" is already decorated for Christmas; in fact, much of the world is already celebrating

Christmas. We, however, as disciples of Jesus have just begun to prepare. While the secular world is being overwhelmed with the commercialism of the "shopping season", we are called to prayerfully prepare for the coming of Christ.

Because society jumps right into Christmas after Thanksgiving, we are often in danger of losing sight of the true nature of the Advent season. This is a time of joyful anticipation of the coming of Christ, not just as a babe in Bethlehem, but also for His coming at the end of time. I realize that we all have to take some time to prepare for the physical celebration of Christmas, but I also hope and pray that we all take time to spiritually prepare during the holy season of Advent. Without this spiritual preparation, all the shopping, wrapping, baking, decorating, etc., is ultimately worthless because it is not a reflection of the joy we should have at the coming of the Prince of Peace; a joy that only comes from prayer.

To help all of us with the discipline of prayer this Advent, we are once again making available copies of the Magnificat Advent Companion. This is a wonderful booklet that offers a brief reflection for each day of this season of joyful anticipation and preparation. I hope each of us makes use of this resource.

Next Saturday, December 8th, is the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary**. This is the patronal feast of both the Church in the United States and of the Diocese of Syracuse. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses will be celebrated at Our Lady of Pompei/St. Peter on Saturday at 8:00 AM and at St. John the Baptist/Holy Trinity 10:00 AM. Please plan on joining the community in prayer as we seek the intercession of our Heavenly Patroness.

Next Sunday, December 9th, Bishop Cunningham will once again be awarding the Immaculata Award. His Excellency instituted this award several years ago in honor of the 125th Anniversary of the Diocese of Syracuse. The award is given to a lay person from each parish who generously and unselfishly volunteers time and service to their parish. I am pleased to announce that this year's recipient of the Immaculata Award from St. John the Baptist/Holy Trinity is **Patty Schramm**. Patty is involved in so many aspects of parish life. She is an Extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, involved with our school alumni, co-ordinates the International Food Festival, and is always there to lend a helping hand at parish events. The list of Patty's activities, past and present, in our parish could go on and on. I am extremely pleased that the Bishop is recognizing the great contribution she makes to this parish.
