

## Second Sunday In Advent

"In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar...and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee...and Lysanias was tetrach of..." Did you need to pinch yourself awake during the first few lines of this Sunday's Gospel? John the Baptist received quite a prelude today as Luke described the religious and political leadership of the time period. Scripture is divinely inspired, and we believe that everything that made it into the Bible is there for a reason. These lines remind us of an important truth. The Christmas story isn't a fairy tale or nursery rhyme. It's not a parable we say to give meaning to the holiday. At Christmas, God's presence is made tangible in a precise moment in time. The birth of Christ is a historical event. As precursor to Jesus' preaching, the ministry of John the Baptist is also a historical event.

"Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." John's call to repentance and the forgiveness of sins happened in a particular time and place. But that does not mean it is limited to first century Palestine! God continues to move in our daily lives. What we hear in today's Gospel - and what we anticipate at Christmas - occurs in our daily lives. God works in concrete ways in time and space. He did that 2,000 years ago, and He continues to do so today!

This Sunday, examine your own Christmas preparations. Is there anything you need to repent of before the Christmas season? Are there low points in your life, valleys to "be filled" by the love of God? Are their mountainous obstacles in your spiritual life? How can they be "made low"? Are you making decisions that have moved you away from God? This Advent season is the time for them to "be made straight and? made smooth." Prepare the way in your heart for Christ today!

#### Dear Parishioners,

I am sure this past week was difficult for many of us as the Bishop released the names of the priests who had credible accusations of abuse made

against them. Several of those priests served in our parish and perhaps some of us still remembered them fondly and now we are confused, angry, hurt, shocked, saddened. The list can go on and on. This is a great challenge to the Church, not just as an institution, but also as the community of believers, made up of individuals struggling to live The Faith in an incredibly difficult world. For many of us, the challenges to living that Faith just became even more daunting. I wish I knew the words to say that could help all of us through the challenges of these days, but sadly I don't. I do know, however, that the answer to all of our problems is to be found in that very Faith that has been challenged: the answer is Jesus Himself. During this Holy Season of Advent the focus of our prayer is asking Jesus to come to us. More than ever we need to cry out to Him to come to His people: to come and heal those who have been abused; to come to restore the Faith to those who have been scandalized; to come and bring a spirit of true repentance to those who abused and misused their authority in the Church; to come and fill His Church with His love, His joy, and His peace.

It is my hope that all of us will take the opportunity this Advent to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. On Monday, December 17th, the Diocese will be celebrating The Light Is On For You Campaign. On that evening every Catholic Church in the Diocese will be open and a priest available to hear confessions from 4-7PM. This year, I will be hearing confessions at Our Lady of Pompei/St. Peter. Also, we have scheduled confessions for Thursday and Friday, December 13 & 14 from 4:30 – 6:00 PM at St. John the Baptist/Holy Trinity as well as Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, December 18, 20, & 21 from 4:00 – 6:30 at Our Lady of Pompei/St. Peter. Please plan on celebrating this wonderful gift from the Lord during this season of joyful anticipation and preparation.

I hope all is going well in your spiritual preparations this Advent. Please continue on your journey focused on the Lord Jesus. You all remain in my prayers; please keep me in yours.
