Welcome:

Listed below are the safety measures that we have in place for our parishes, Our Lady of Pompei/St. Peter and St. John the Baptist/ Holy Trinity. If you have not attended Mass recently but are thinking about returning, below are the guidelines we are following:

- The church is completely sanitized after each Mass/Funeral.
- Pews are taped off to ensure 6 feet social distancing.

- The Collection Basket can longer be passed so there is a collection box at the entrance of the main Church for your offering.

Do we trust this call and request? Trust commits us to the relationship and makes a claim on who we are. Finally, we are asked to act. We find ourselves acting, not in the way we used to, but in a transformed, more enlightened way. Things seem clearer and all that is around us shines with the brilliance of God's presence. God's call came through a cloud, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him," This is the call and the request. Can we give God our trust and do as God asks?

Lenten Pretzel...Continued

Last week was the story of the Lenten Pretzel and this week we have a recipe for pretzels.

Ingredients & oven set to 375

- 2 packages active dry yeast
- 1 cup warm water
- 3 1/2 cups all purpose flour
- 2 tablespoons white sugar
- 1 tablespoon butter, melted

- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 egg yolk

Coarse salt

- stir the yeast into 1 cup warm water in a large bow. Then 1) beat in flour, sugar, butter and salt to make a dough, followed by putting the dough onto a floured surface and kneading for 5 minutes.
- 2) Place the dough into a greased bowl and let it rise in a warm place until doubled, about 1 hour. When the hour is up, punch the dough down and divide into 12 equal size pieces. Then, roll each piece into a rope 18-20 inches long.
- 3) After you have all your strands of dough shape them to look lie pretzels and put them on a greased baking sheet.
- 4) Beat the egg yolk with 1 tablespoon of water in a small bowl and brush the yolk mixture over each pretzel. Finally, sprinkle each one with course salt. Bake until golden brown. About 15 minutes. Enjoy!
